Greetings Siblings in Christ -

October is here and as 2024 winds down, Newburg's Administrative Committees and Ministry Teams are leaning into God's guidance for 2025. Our plans for Youth and Children's ministries for the 2024-25 academic year are underway and some will continue to develop as the year rolls out. The Fall Rummage

Sale into which so many of you pour your time and effort is happening the first weekend of October, right around the time this Newsletter is being published. Our missions teams are hard at work planning for the Thanksgiving Community Meal, the Warmth Drive, Children's Christmas, gathering support for travelers to Guatemala to support Salud y Paz, and many other ongoing missional causes. And of course, the Worship Design Team is working on Advent and Christmas and developing and designing worship for the coming year.

All these activities, missional efforts, and ministries are not only in place to support the people of Newburg and the community around us but are also supported by the people of Newburg and the community around us. Ministry and Mission are done in a cyclical pattern. Ministries and mission projects are in place to help form followers of Christ, who then find their place in the ministries and missional efforts that help form other followers of Christ. In Colossians 1:3-14, Paul is praising God for this very kind of work the Church at Colossae has been doing. In verses 5-6 Paul writes, "...You have heard of this hope before in the word of the truth, the gospel 6 that has come to you. Just as it is bearing fruit and growing in the whole world, so it has been bearing fruit among yourselves from the day you heard it and truly comprehended the grace of God." I agree with Paul in the idea that the good news of Jesus Christ comes to us and then bears fruit in our lives. That fruit is found in willing hearts that continue to participate in the ministries of the Church that move us forward in the mission of God's Church.

It is in the spirit of this idea that the Finance Team presents the theme for this year's pledge campaign, "The Mission Continues." This theme acknowledges the good work you are doing and financially supporting already and reminds us that we are in no way done. The important work your gifts support lives in the ongoing cycle of attracting people to Jesus through the example shown them in good works born out of love and at the same time deepens our love for God and one another. Expect to hear more about this theme from the administrative leaders at Newburg between now and November 24, as they bring testimony to the work of God in their lives and to the good work being accomplished through the generosity of the Newburg community past and present.

There are some things you should know about my approach to generosity. First, I believe generosity breeds generosity. The individual giving of our members inspires the giving of those around us. Second, what you contribute financially is not about the rules and expectations of the Church, but rather about your response to the generosity God has shown you in your life. You will hear me say, "Give as the Holy Spirit leads you to give, nothing more and nothing less." I believe that if each of us responds to God's generosity honestly, within our own capacity to give, Newburg will have all it needs to do the work to which we are called.

This year's pledge campaign culminates on November 24. On that day we will gather the pledges we have received, collect additional pledges in worship, ask God's blessing upon them, and seek God's guidance in their responsible use. Together, we will continue our mission.

This UNPACKED discussion group seeks to explore the early years of the Christian church, as many leaders of the new church expressed wildly different ideas of the faith, the belief in Jesus and how to worship. We will use a book entitled *The Apocryphal Gospels* (translated and introduced by Simon Gathercole) as our guide for this study while we compare writings that did not make it into the New Testament with those that did. Lectio Divina | Tuesdays at 1pm | Asbury Lounge

Lectio Divina is a Latin phrase meaning Divine Listening. The practice is a simple spiritual discipline that allows one to have a deep encounter with scripture. In Lectio Divina, the same scripture passage is read four times. After each reading, the leader invites you to respond to the passage with a word or phrase that catches your attention, the feelings the passage evokes, finding images, thoughts or memories that rise in response to the passage, or how is God is speaking to you through the passage. Participants are asked to share these thoughts, but no one is required to share. Starting in September, we will focus our readings on the Psalms. One of the best things about Lectio Divina is that every group meeting is a new start; nothing is carried over from week to week and there is no homework. Therefore, drop in anytime! Led by Dr. Frank Dunbar.


