Read. Study. Pray. offers a simple way to engage Sunday's scripture during the week. **Begin with Matthew 5:43-48.** Read slowly. Read once for flow, then again for meaning. Notice repeated words and the speaker. Move to study by choosing one verse. Ask clear questions. Who speaks. What promise appears. What brings surprise. Use a brief Bible note or talk with others if helpful. Then pray. Thank God for a blessing named in the passage. Practice one teaching during the week. Pray for those preparing to teach and lead on Sunday. Sit quietly for a moment. Start small. Return to the passage during the week.

Church Council guides vision and direction for ministry at Newburg United Methodist Church. Council shapes how you worship, serve, and grow together.

Council focuses on three areas.

Nurture. Worship, discipleship, small groups, stewardship.

Outreach. Missions, service, community partnerships.

Witness. Evangelism, hospitality, communication.

Council includes the pastor, lay leader, delegates to Annual Conference, and leaders from Finance, Trustees, and Staff Parish. Council also includes youth, young adults, ministry leaders, and members from across the congregation. Your voice matters.

Church Council meets several times each year. Every member shares responsibility for this work. Participation strengthens ministry and deepens connection.




March 1st-5th, Augusta Georgia Mission Trip
