Read. Study. Pray. offers a simple way to engage Sunday's scripture during the week. **Begin with Matthew 5:21-26, 38-42.** Read slowly. Read once for flow, then again for meaning. Notice repeated words and the speaker. Move to study by choosing one verse. Ask clear questions. Who speaks. What promise appears. What brings surprise. Use a brief Bible note or talk with others if helpful. Then pray. Thank God for a blessing named in the passage. Practice one teaching during the week. Pray for those preparing to teach and lead on Sunday. Sit quietly for a moment. Start small. Return to the passage during the week.



Honoring Dr. King Through Service and “Good Trouble”

This MLK Day, our **Newburg Student Ministry and Young Adults** joined forces with several other UMC congregations at Central UMC-Detroit to turn Dr. King's vision of the "Beloved Community" into action.

Together, we worked side-by-side to assemble **over 600 packed lunches** for our neighbors at NOAH at Central. It was a morning filled with energy, purpose, and the reminder that small acts of service contribute to a much larger movement of care in our city.

Beyond the service work, our students and young adults engaged in a deep reflection on Dr. King's enduring message. We specifically explored the concept of getting into "**Good Trouble**"—a phrase championed by the late John Lewis that echoes Rev. Dr. King's call for nonviolent resistance and standing up for justice even when it is uncomfortable.

We left Detroit feeling inspired to not only serve our friends at [NOAH at Central](#), but to continue asking how we can be voices for equity and peace in our own communities.

Understanding the UMC: Structure & Function

Each week we'll take a closer look at *how leadership works across the United Methodist Church*. We'll focus on three key parts of the church's structure—how decisions are made, who provides spiritual guidance, and how accountability is maintained. Our goal is to help you see how these connections shape our shared life at Newburg and beyond.

General Commission on Religion and Race (GCORR)

What it is

GCORR is a United Methodist Church agency that started in 1968 to focus on racism and inclusion in the church.

They exist so the church takes the subject of race seriously. It helps leaders and members look at how bias and exclusion show up in church life. It supports work toward justice and fairness.

Core mission

- Promote fairness in church systems.
- Build skills for cross-cultural ministry.
- Lead honest conversations about race and faith.
- Offer tools, training, and resources.

This work is practical. It shapes how congregations interact with diverse communities. It changes how leaders make decisions about ministry and mission.

Key focus areas

GCORR does not just talk about issues. It offers clear steps for growth. Resources include guides, workshops, and learning tools. This agency works to train church leaders and members with resources for healthy conversations about race. They take action by reviewing of policies to reduce barriers and provide support for developing diverse teams and inclusive ministry.

Why it matters for our denomination

The United Methodist Church is global and diverse. GCORR helps our denomination reflect that diversity. It equips leaders to serve people from different cultures and backgrounds with respect and understanding. GCORR's work strengthens the church's witness. When we engage across cultures with honesty and care, we grow as followers of Jesus. The church becomes more welcoming for all.
